From the Pastor . . .

It is hard to believe that today (March 20th) is the first day of spring.

During Lent we are encouraged to soul search and seek meaning for our life. Members of our congregation and our community are struggling with isolation, making sense out of serious health issues they themselves or loved ones are suffering through. Especially during the Lenten season, we can take time to remember when we feel lost or lonely. When we sense we have hit a brick wall we search for a way out. We look for a path out of the wilderness. Finding meaning and joy can be a difficult task.

During this season of Lent, we travel with Jesus on a journey which starts in the wilderness and travel with him through the last days of his life. It is during this time that we focus our energy on our personal relationship with God and practice showing God to others in our lives.

Trappist monk Thomas Merton said, "The whole Christian life is a life in which...the more we progress, the poorer we get so that the man who has progressed most, is totally poor—he has to depend directly on God. He's got nothing left in himself."

Doesn't it sound scary to have complete faith and trust in God? Please share with one another how you have made room for God in your life.

They believe that "Together with individuals, charities, businesses and government we can end hunger." They reported that last year they provided **4 billion meals**. This is why we've chosen to continue our focus on Feeding America in April.

Moderator Musings



Where do you put your elbow grease?

I used the term “spiritual elbow grease” in the Wednesday night book study that I enjoyed with other members of our church. I was talking about how the class has resulted in extra work being applied to our faith spirit.

It seems the term “elbow grease” was used nearly 350 years ago in a poem that was written in 1672. The poem was written as satire against Samuel Parker who was an English church leader.

The poem was titled Rehearsal Transpos'd and was written by Andrew Marvell. He used it to describe the power of the written word vs. the spoken word. The written words could circulate unhinged, but the spoken words can change and even be rebutted in oratory discussions.

Part of what he wrote was:

Two or Three fellows in a corner with ink and elbow grease do more harm than a hundred systematical divines with their sweaty preaching.

The term “elbow grease” is an idiom for physical work. So how did this term continue through the years to end up meaning hard work or extra work, which sometimes may be all that is needed.

Certainly, we have all used elbow grease to clean many things. From household items to vehicles to treasures from the past, buried deep in the soil. They all take extra elbow grease to restore them.

I used the term to mean extra work being put into better understanding of the bible and all that it offers. But how often do we use elbow grease to find the faults of others? We put in extra time complaining about something we really have no control over and does not affect us. Look at the world around us.

Perhaps we should all use some spiritual elbow grease to get back to a better understanding of “love your neighbor as yourself.” These thoughts appear in both the book of Mark and Matthew. Maybe it was put there twice so we might pick up on it.?

So, let's put that spiritual elbow grease to good use. We hope all the extra work with your “spiritual elbow grease”, results in a positive way.

Summary of Monday, March 8, 2021 Coordinating Council and Deacons Meeting

A joint meeting of coordinating council and deacons was called to order via zoom, at 6:00 p.m., on Monday, March 8, 2021, by Tom Wiley. Present were Tom, Deb, Judy, Rolf, Brenda, Caryl, Petra, and Nancy.

Caryl offered the opening prayer.

The agenda was reviewed, aiming for an end time of 7:15 p.m..

Caryl made a motion, seconded by Rolf, and passed, to accept the minutes of the February 16, 2021 meeting.

Craig Messinger joined the meeting to discuss pot roast suppers for 2021. We will plan to start in May, they will still be a drive through event. We agreed on price of \$12 per meal, we will continue to ask people to make reservations. Craig and Rolf will increase this number to account for those who do not call ahead. We agreed on the second Saturday of each month, Craig will get dates and other information to Judy in time for the April Weathervane. Caryl suggested that we also hold a pie sale during the October supper as a fundraiser.

Treasurer's Report: Brenda presented the financial report for February. Current contributions were \$2,945 for the month in the general fund. This was less than budget for the month by \$1,180, but over budget for the year by \$407. There have been no new pledges. Rent for January and February was received this month. Total income of \$4,773 was under budget for the month by \$1,035, but over budget by \$607 year to date. Most expenses, except for heating oil were under budget for the year. There were two oil deliveries for the church in February. Brenda is going to look into why expenses for secretary are under budget. Total expenses of \$7,105 was under budget for the month by \$2,189. Brenda is continuing to keep an eye on the cash flow. Nancy made a motion, seconded by Caryl and passed to accept treasurer's report subject to year end review.

Clerk: Judy reported that she has completed inputting 2020 membership and statistical information into the UCC data hub.

Trustees: Rolf reported that he has had to raise set point on thermostats to maintain a better air flow in the building, heating cost may go up slightly.

Missions: Caryl reported that our mission for February had been Good Shepherd Food Bank. We will be sending them \$350, \$250 from Missions budget, \$100 from donations from congregation. In March, our mission project will be Feeding America. We will also be

collecting for the first special UCC offering of the year in March, One Great Hour of Sharing.

Stewardship: Brenda has recently sent out stewardship statements and letter, trying to get a few more pledges in.

Deacons: Deacons had met on Sunday, March 7th, focusing on Lent activities. Petra will be on vacation from April 5th through April 13th, and out of the pulpit on Sundays, April 11th and 18th. The deacons will do a lay service on the 11th. Rev. Allison Curry will preach on the 18th.

Moderator: There was discussion on when we want to get into the church to work on sound issues. Tom also reported that Keith would like to receive enlarged copies of the hymns for each Sunday. It was suggested that Keith be in touch directly with Lori to set this up.

Pastor: Petra reminded us that the Maundy Thursday service will be on the same link that we use for worship on Sunday mornings. On Easter morning, April 4th, we have been invited to join the Casco church for a 6:30 a.m. sunrise service, in their parking lot. There will not be a breakfast following the service this year. Our regular Easter morning 10:00 a.m. service will be via zoom. People are asked to purchase their own Easter flowers to share with everyone on zoom. There will be some Easter flowers in the church. Lori will be singing as part of our Easter morning service. There was a discussion on how to best use soloists on zoom, would it work better to pre record them. Petra reported that there are 8 people, including herself in the Lenten book study. It is going well.

Old Business: none

New Business: There was brief discussion on reopening, possibly May 1st. Judy will talk with Lori about when to print Weathervane, and will get out date for when they need information for it. There was brief discussion about what would happen if we all unmute ourselves and try to do prayer or sing together during worship. Input from Brenda is that it may not sound good. We will, however, try and do the Lord's Prayer together on Easter.

The next meeting will be April 20th, at 6:00 p.m.. Meeting was adjourned at 7:00 p.m.
