Dear RVCC Family and Friends,

It is Saturday, May 22nd, 2021 as I write this newsletter piece. I am so excited because in one day, on Pentecost Sunday, May 23rd we will back in our sanctuary.

Summary of Monday, April 28, 2021 Coordinating Council and Deacons Meeting

A joint meeting of the Coordinating Council and Deacons was called to order via zoom, on Monday, April 28, 2021, at 5:00 PM, by Tom Wiley. Present were Tom, Rolf, Brenda, Caryl, Deb, Nancy, Petra, and Judy.

The opening prayer was offered by Rolf.

The agenda was reviewed, finish time of 6:30 was set if possible.

Caryl made a motion, seconded by Rolf to accept the minutes of the meeting of March 8, 2021.

Treasurer's Report: Brenda presented the report for March 2021. Current contributions were \$5,120 for the month in the general fund, this was more than budget by \$653 for the month, and more than budget, year to date, by \$1,056. We also recorded a non budgeted increase in our American Funds for the first quarter of \$2,497. Total income of \$9,203 was over budget by \$3,244 for the month, and \$3,852 year to date. Total expenses of \$8,958 was over budget for the month by by \$1,161 but under budget year to date by \$775. Caryl made a motion, seconded by Nancy, to accept the treasurer's report subject to year end review.

Reports of the Coordinators:

Clerk: nothing to report

Trustees: Rolf reported that we had received a \$5,000 "resourcing the local church" grant from the Cumberland Association of the UCC, the maximum amount of this grant. We will have to spend that money and then get reimbursed by them. He is working on scheduling professionals for certain parts of the project, but there will be plenty of ways to involve members of the congregation and to generate excitement about this handicap accessible project. Rolf also announced that he has done the annual filings which need to be done with the state each year.

Missions: Judy announced that school and hygiene kits need to be delivered to local collection site by May 6. We have materials for school kits, and are working on collecting completed hygiene kits. Caryl announced that we will focus on the Fuller Center in June. They are now finally able to do more, are educating people about what they do, and actively looking for volunteers.

Christian Education: Petra reported that Lenten book study had gone well. People seemed to enjoy doing it on zoom, might continue to use that format, even post Covid.

Stewardship: First pot roast supper is coming up on May 8, Craig does need help.

Deacons: have been focused on reopening to in person worship.

Moderator: Tom emphasized once again that we are a good team, and are doing a good job together.

Pastor: Petra announced that she will be involved in the Empower ME wellness fair on May 16, at St. Ann's church in Windham. She will also attend, via zoom, a Threshold conference on the art and science of dying. She needs to do this for continuing education credit. She also reported that she, Lori, and Dan have been preparing walls in upstairs hallway for painting. Caryl volunteered to help with painting.

Old Business: Caryl reported that a lot of church stuff is on her google drive, and needs to be removed. She and Brenda will get together and make this happen.

New Business – plans for reopening: Tom, Judy, and Petra reported on key points from the Cumberland Association Workshop on reopening. We need to find new ways to go about it, celebrate with a splash, have a special event each week. We want to start with Pentecost, which in itself can be a splashy event. We also need to celebrate what we missed most about worshipping together. We have money in our budget for special music, we talked about holding coffee hour outside. The Deacons will meet this Sunday to start planning the first four Sundays in person, which will begin on May 23.

The next meeting will be on Tuesday, May 11, at 5:00 PM. The meeting was adjourned at 6:30.

Summary of Tuesday, May 11, 2021 Coordinating Council and Deacons Meeting

A joint meeting of coordinating council and deacons was called to order via zoom on Tuesday, May 11, 2021, at 5:00 PM, by Tom Wiley. Present were Tom, Deb, Judy, Rolf, Brenda, Caryl, Petra and Nancy.

The agenda was reviewed, an end time was set.

Caryl made a motion, seconded by Nancy Yates, and approved to accept the minutes of the April 28, 2021 meeting.

Treasurer's Report: Brenda presented the financial report for April. She is pleased and hopeful by the numbers. Contributions were \$5,275 for the month in the general fund. This was over budget by \$808. Year to date contributions are over budget by \$1868. Total income of \$6,687 is over budget by \$879 for the month, and over budget by \$4,730 year to date. This includes the gain of \$2,498 in the American Funds. Expenses of \$7,153 was under budget by \$2,694 for the month, and under budget by \$3,468 year to date. Brenda reported that she does expect, however to need to withdraw \$10,000 in May for cash flow purposes. Caryl made a motion, seconded by Nancy Yates, and approved to accept the treasurer's report subject to year end review.

Clerk: nothing to report

Trustees: Rolf reported that cleaning in the sanctuary will occur before the opening on the 23rd. He is repairing some broken windows. He has sent a message to the scouts to try and get the parking lot cleaned.

Missions: We will focus on the Fuller Center in June. Focus on the food pantry will be later in the year.

Moderator: nothing to report at this point.

Pastor: A friend of Petra's (nick's mother) does mediations. She has asked if she could use space in our building on May 22, from 1 – 4:30. Council approved of this. This Sunday is the Wellness Fair at St. Ann's Church in Windham, from 10:00 until 1:00. Petra will leave as soon as service is over to attend. Catherine Berry has been making phone calls to remind people that we are back worshipping in person on May 23. Petra, the deacons, and Will will meet at the church on May 19, at 3 to go over plans and technical things for reopening. Will has been out and checked out the microphones.

Stewardship: At our first pot roast supper, 84 meals were served, \$960 collected. We cleared over \$700.

Old Business: Brenda presented a request from RAA, they want to do live stream show in sanctuary in June, no

firm date, no audience, and no masks for performers. This was approved.

New Business: Final plans for reopening on May 23 were discussed. Guidelines will be similar to what they were last fall. We need to appoint a new committee to search for a pianist. Suggestions were made to ask Craig, Caryl, Lori, and Alice Oldford. We need to make sure we have a leader for the group. It was suggested we could work with other churches, possibly Casco and Windham on music needs.

The deacons will meet again on June 6, at 2 PM. Council again on June 15, at 5 PM.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:00 PM.

The council has continued to have discussions in regards to reopening. We want to inform all of you that our intent is move slowly to ensure safety for all. Despite what CDC and Maine guidelines say, we will adopt the following for the next 3 weeks

We will be singing, doing responsive prayers and readings. Because of that we will be requiring masks for all when they are inside the building with the exceptions below.

These services will now be taped and will be distributed through the church's you tube channel:


