It's a privilege to start our work together at this particular moment in time, as we begin to imagine what our post-pandemic realities will look like for the church. The pandemic has had a tremendous cost, and yet it's offering us a once-in-a-lifetime chance to pause and reimagine who we want be as the gathered body of Christ and how we want to operate moving forward.

New COVID Guidelines

Based on changes at the State level and the ending of the State of Emergency in the State of Maine, the following changes were decided upon at our June Council/Deacon meeting: We still need to maintain some social distancing, but do not need to worry about restricting numbers in the sanctuary. It was agreed that we can now go in through the vestry, and up those stairs to the sanctuary. People who have been vaccinated do not need to wear masks except to sing. 
LINE DANCING, YEAAAH!!!!

Summary of Tuesday, June 15, 2021 Coordinating Council and Deacons Meeting

The meeting of the coordinating council and deacons was called to order at 5:00 PM on Tuesday, June 15, 2021 by Tom Wiley. Present were Rolf, Brenda, Tom, Judy, Petra, Caryl, Deb, and Nancy Yates.

Deb Feagans offered the opening prayer.

The agenda was reviewed, finish time was tentatively set for 6:15 PM. The council/deacon get together at the home of Tom and Bonnie was tentatively changed from the 14th to 15th of July.

Treasurer's Report: Brenda presented the Treasurer's Report. Contributions are doing well. She did take money from the American Funds for cash flow purposes. Current contributions were \$5,706 for the month in the general fund, this was more than budget by \$1,239. Year to date contributions are \$3,108 over budget. Non pledged contributions were \$863 better than budget for the month, and this was the first month we have recorded any "loose plate" offering. First pot roast supper raised \$706 of net income. Total income of \$7,629 was over budget by \$1,520 for the month, and over budget \$6,251 year to date. This includes gain of \$2,498 in the American Funds. Expenses for the most part were under budget, with the exception of Diaconate. We used one supply pastor in May, and we paid Patrick for three weeks in advance. Total expenses of \$7,814 was under budget by \$1,742 for the month, and under budget by \$5,210 year to date. Nancy Yates made a motion, seconded by Rolf, and approved, to accept the Treasurer's Report subject to year end review.

Discussion on Reopening Guidelines: The following points were agreed upon, to go into effect on July 1: We still need to maintain some social distancing, but do not need to worry about restricting numbers in the sanctuary. It was agreed that we can now go in through the vestry, and up those stairs to the sanctuary. People who have been vaccinated do not need to wear masks except to sing. If not vaccinated, we request a mask be worn at all times anywhere in the building. Coffee hour will continue to be held outside, if weather is nice. There was discussion on singing more verses of hymns, no decisions were made. It was agreed to record services only on communion Sunday during July and August. Line dancing will be able to resume in the Vestry after July 1. No masks required for those who have been vaccinated. Non vaccinated are requested to wear masks.

Discussion on Vaccine Clinic: It was decided to revisit this item in the fall. At this point, you need to guarantee 10

people to hold a clinic. It does not seem that we would be serving a hard to reach population at this point, and vaccines are readily available in local pharmacies.

Reports of the Coordinators:

Clerk: nothing to report

Trustees: Rolf reported that Caryl had primed the front doors into the Sanctuary, they still need to have a final coat. Air conditioning units have been installed. The boy scouts have done the outside clean up.

Missions: Caryl reported that the Fuller Center is our mission for June. We do not have a mission for July, she will ask for suggestions.

Christian Education: Petra reported that she does a kids moment when Emma is in church.

Stewardship: It is time for statements to go out again to those who pledge.

Deacons: The Deacons are trying to get people to volunteer to cover coffee hour.

Moderator: nothing new to report.



New Business: Tom will put a teaser in the all church email about changes in worship protocol which are coming up. He will wait until closer to July 1 to put all the changes in. These changes also need to go in the Weathervane. Weathervane will be printed on June 24. Our next meeting will be Tuesday, July 27, at 5:00PM.
