From the Pastor ...

As you may know, Pastor Petra is in Germany tending to her Mother's affairs, through the end of September. Caryl Gilman has written the pastor column this month.

It is with *great joy* that we will welcome back Pastor Petra on Sunday October 2nd. I am happy she will return to us as I've missed her. As we welcome her home, we also need to understand that she and her family are navigating toward a new norm without her mom. We must continue to keep them all in our prayers.

I know from personal experience that, when my parents both passed away, my siblings and I felt the "hole" they left and realized **we** were now the "senior" generation for the family. How could that be?

My siblings and I felt anything from sad/uncomfortable to terribly distraught or distressed within days or minutes. We all privately dealt with death in our own way. We also learned that there is no timeline or "normal" way to grieve.

Whenever I cross paths with grief, it feels like something I stumble through hoping to do the best I can for myself and others. The Bible does have some help:

First Thessalonians 4:13-14 says

¹³ Brothers and sisters, we do not want you to be uninformed about those who sleep in death, so that you do not grieve like the rest of mankind, who have no hope. ¹⁴ For we believe that Jesus died and rose again, and so we believe that God will bring with Jesus those who have fallen asleep in him.

<u>Psalm 147:3</u> says, "He heals the brokenhearted and binds up their wounds."

I try to remember this saying "God does not leave his children in the depths of sorrow. Joy comes eventually, and it comes in God's timing." To me this means, hugs for Petra when she returns and, over time, asking if there is anything I can do. In addition, like checking in to say "Hi".

Missions: mid-October through mid-November - Seafarer's Friend

The mission at Seafarer's Friend is to extend the ministry of the churches to meet the unmet spiritual, social and practical needs of seafarers in the New England Maritime Community. They engage seafarers, their families and community by visiting aboard ships, welcoming and hosting seafarers ashore and being attentive to their needs, including ways to contact home, a clean and safe place to relax offshore, transportation to shopping centers, as well as social, educational and recreational activities. They also provide Ditty Bags = a bag full of personal items.

Many thanks to Sarah Allen, who has prepared the bags for the items!

We participated in this ministry about a year ago and I (Caryl) learned a lot about collecting items. Last year I ended up with a lot of toothbrushes and toothpaste but none of other items. 
